Congratulations on your interest in pursuing a Bachelor of Applied Science in Teacher Education (BASTE) degree! APPLICATION DEADLINE

• Full-time enrollment for Fall quarter opens on January 1, and applications will continue to be accepted until February 21 of the current academic year.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must have met the following requirements:

- Earned at least an Associates of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Early Childhood Education, closely related field, or completed at least 96-98 college-level credits from an academic transfer or career/technical program.
- Completed the Early Childhood Education (ECE) prerequisite courses, including major support courses with a minimum 2.7 GPA (see prerequisite information).
- Completed the General Education prerequisite courses with a minimum 2.0 GPA (see prerequisite information).
- Completed or scheduled the required WEST-B exam (Reading, Writing, and Math). See WEST-B section of application for more information. Schedule or request accommodations at https://www.west.nesinc.com/Home.aspx.
- Resume (One-page maximum)
- Teaching Philosophy Statement (max. 500 words)
 - 1. Highlight your professional and personal experience in the early childhood education setting.
 - 2. Outline your career goals in the field of education and how this degree will support those goals.

If you have questions about prerequisites, we encourage you to consult the School of Education completion coaches They can help determine if equivalent courses meet your eligibility requirements. Contact information is provided in the following pages.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- All students must be enrolled full-time during the 2-year cohort program including the student teacher residency in the second year.
- All admitted students are required to complete a criminal background check which includes fingerprinting and screening administered through the Office for the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Additional information will be provided upon admission.
- Applicants are strongly encouraged to submit their applications early; seats in these classes are limited. For your application to be considered, all steps must be completed with the required materials submitted.
- If you have transcripts from another institution, they must be evaluated for equivalency through Student Records.
